RESOLUTION

- 6. Matters involving tactics and techniques used for protecting the safety and property of the public, as well as investigations of violations or possible violations of the law.
- 7. Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiations, other than collective negotiations, in which the public body is or may become a party.
- 8. Matters falling within the attorney/client privilege.
- 9. Matters relating to personnel involving employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of, promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body.
- 10. Matters involving the quasi-judicial deliberations of a public body that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty or the suspension or loss of a license or permit as a result of an act or omission for which the party bears responsibility.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Old Tappan Board of Education will disclose to the public the minutes of this session when the need for confidentiality no longer exists.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the private executive session aforementioned take place in the Conference Room at the Charles DeWolf Middle School forthwith.
